EQUITY & MEMBERSHIP


- » Equity is bigger than bike share

PLANNING & SITING

» As a City program, we have tried to equally distribute stations throughout the City while providing a connected network



BIKE SHARE EXPANSION IN 2015



475 stations with
4750 bikes across 31 wards bordered by:

- Touhy on the NORTH
- Pulaski on the WEST
- 75th on the SOUTH

HIRING

- » Greencorps Chicago adult program
 - » City of Chicago's green job training program
 - » Divvy hired approximately 10 graduates in 2013 and 2014
- » Skills for Chicagoland's Future
 - » PPP working to match businesses that have current, unmet hiring needs with qualified, unemployed job seekers
 - 2013 hired approximately 20 individuals through Skills
 - 2014 "Optimum Employment" with Divvy & The GAP stores

GREENCORP CHICAGO YOUTH PROGRAM



- » Two Core Areas Horticulture and Biking
- » Regional Capacity and Strong Institutional Knowledge from CDOT and DFSS
- » High Quality Instructors and Mentors (10:1 youth to mentors)
- » 6 Weeks of Paid Work Experience for 600 Youth (Ages 16-19) in 2013 and 900 Youth in 2014 from CPS at-risk-for-violence high schools.
- 3 140 Youth Continued in Year-Round Employment in 2013
