1. *Parking Pricing and Curbside Management in New York City* by Bruce Schaller, Tom Maguire, David Stein, Willa Ng and Manzell Blakeley.

The document, written by staff from the NYC DOT, summarizes some of the innovative parking management strategies being implemented in New York City in commercial loading zones and residential neighborhoods. The paper provides a summary of the benefits associated with the strategies and best practices recommendations for cities interested in implementing similar programs.

2. *Non-Toll Pricing: A Primer* by Federal Highway Administration.

The Primer provides a general overview of non-toll pricing strategies. In addition to discussing parking strategies, it also covers mileage-based pricing strategies and provides guidance for government agencies seeking to implement non-toll pricing.
