Street food makes for vibrant living streets. Vending can also be an economic opportunity for low income residents. Properly regulated, street food and movile food could also be a source of healthy food in areas that lack enough farmers markets and grocery stores. Since vending on the sidewalk is currently illegal in the City of Los Angeles, policy makers lack carrots or sticks to encourage more venders to sell fruits,

vegetables and healthy meals and snacks. See the link for some policy options to encourage healthy street vending



Sidewalks are needed at Bus Stops

Many bus and transit stops in my area are not near sidewalks, leaving the users to walk along a narrow strip between the street and a guard rail or trees. It is important to take a comprehensive approach when planning these facilities so that users can feel safe when choosing alternative modes of transportation.

MindMixer Rules of Engagement:

- 1. Clearly state the purpose for the site where everyone can see it.
- 2. Have a plan for what you are going to do with the feedback you get.
- 3. Make the first question interesting, broad, and approachable.
- 4. Make every question as compelling as possible.
- 5. 4-5 questions is an optimal number for the site at any given time. More than6 is too many.
- 6. Your site will have participants who will want to submit ideas, others who will prefer polls and seconding other's ideas, and some who want both.

 Make sure to mix question types for optimal participation.
- 7. Make sure you show participants that you are listening to what they say by responding to ideas and updating idea status.
- 8. Continue to advertise the importance of the site in e-mail blasts, newsletters, and in-person meetings.
- 9. Integrate images and videos of your community wherever possible.
- 10. Never let the site get stale.

Tech business tips to Planners

- 1. #Fail, but learn from it. And talk about it.
- 2. Never poke a troll.
- 3. A/B test everything (experiment, measure, learn, repeat)
