Summary

On the memorable date of 10/10/10, Los Angeles launched "CicLAvia." This wildly successful open streets initiative was years in the making, but quickly earned Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa's political support following an incident where he was hit by a car while bicycling.

CicLAvia is also the name of the organizing group responsible for the program's creation. CicLAvia was made a reality thanks to the aforementioned support received from the Mayor's Office and other city agencies. Other organizational partners include the Los Angeles County Bicycle Coalition and Metro. According to the Los Angeles Times an estimated 100,000 people attended the inaugural CicLAvia program.

CicLAvia returned with an equal amount of success in April and October 2011, with attendance numbers equaling that of the 2010 initiative. The next CicLAvia is scheduled for April 12, 2012.
