

EVERYONE PAYS THE PRICE



\$15 million

in annual medical costs related to pedestrian injuries

55% of patients charged medical bills to public funds, while 41% charged to private insurance



SEVERE/FATAL INJURIES: 12% OF STREET MILES*







SPEEDING IS #1 FACTOR IN FATAL TRAFFIC COLLISIONS





FATALITY RISK INCREASES



POLICY

PROBLEM

- Unsafe speed is one of the top causes of collisions
- California law prohibits use of ASE to enforce speeding

SOLUTION


Automatic Speed Enforcement

- Cameras used to target unsafe speeds
- Requires State Law change for locals to use











SEATTLE

17 cameras in 9 school zones, 14 more this year

64% decrease in average violations per camera per da

90% of cited drivers did not get another

reduction in average speed of violation in mph above the posted speed limit



AUTOMATED SPEED ENFORCEMENT ISSUES

IMPACT

"Camera enforcement won't slow drivers down."

PRIVACY

"I don't want pictures taken of me."

REVENUE USE

"This is another cash cow for the City."

TECHNOLOGY

"There is an problem with the camera."

FAIRNESS

"Why are you targeting me?"

Proven to reduce speeds

System set up to only photograph license plate
