Pine and Pine Streets in downtown Seattle have the City's highest pedestrian volumes.

Seattle's Pike Pine Streetscape and Bicycle Improvement Project




creates a vital pedestrian and bicycle link through Downtown's retail core, connecting the newly improved Waterfront to Capitol Hill and neighborhoods beyond.

The project's improvements will create a couplet corridor that is more safe, dynamic, and better connected.

The Project creates a curbless block in front of Seattle's iconic Pike Place Market entrance which will serve as a threshold between Downtown, the Market, and the Waterfront beyond. The design opens site lines and provides a flexible, open space for events and pick-up/drop-off spaces to support the surrounding retail and residential development.





The Project takes the bridges where Pike and Pine streets cross Interstate 5 and creates an improved crossing experience for pedestrians and cyclists alike. Sidewalks are widened, bike lanes are protected, and raised pedestrian guardrails incorporate art and enhanced lighting to create a more safe and comfortable environment.

Pike and Pine Streets in downtown Seattle connect Elliott Bay and Seattle's waterfront to the downtown retail core, the Washington State Convention Center, and up to the Capitol Hill neighborhood.
