Development Engineering within the Community Planning Business Unit is seeking skilled and motivated individuals who aspire to work on exciting, city-shaping initiatives. As a Development Engineer, you will be responsible for representing the Development Engineering Division at the Development Approvals Review Team (DART). Primary duties include:

- Review and provide professional municipal and mobility engineering judgment and input on complex planning applications, including: area structure plans and area redevelopment plans; land use applications; outline plan applications; development permits; road closures; subdivision applications and detailed design construction drawings reviews.
- Negotiate and prepare legal agreements to accommodate land development.
- Conduct the final review and sign-off of comments and conditions related to DART applications.
- Provide mobility subject matter expertise input into corporate decisions on various applications.
- Respond to inquiries related to development within an assigned geographic area.
- Attend public and councilor meetings and open houses as required for applications.
- Balance the needs of the City with the development industry to ensure infrastructure is constructed in a safe, timely and effective manner.
- Lead or participate in special projects, task forces and committees that require engineering evaluation and response.
- Represent Community Planning at the Calgary Planning Commission (CPC) and the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB) by responding to questions related to the engineering review of development applications, including technical details of relevant standards, policies and practices.

Qualifications

- A degree in Civil Engineering and at least 4 years of relevant professional engineering experience obtained after receiving your P. Eng. Designation and a current licensure as a Professional Engineer with the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Alberta (APEGA) complete with practicing status OR licensure and practicing status by the first day of work [Click here for more details](#).
- Experience with software such as Computer-aided design (CAD) and Traffic simulation software (e.g., VISSIM, Synchro) is considered an asset.
- Development industry experience, working and negotiating with developers, partners, and interest groups, as well as presenting to legislative and political bodies is considered an asset.
- Experience in construction, civil engineering design and contract management is also considered an asset.
- Effective communication and presentation skills, project management skills and the ability to adapt to changing circumstances in a high-pressure environment.
- Success in this position requires: strong analytical, business planning and organizational effectiveness skills; the ability to lead and coordinate the various strategic objectives of the DART business processes and represent Mobility-related groups across the City.
